



KOMAGATAKE DOUBLE CELLARS 2019

NAGANO, JAPAN

Another playful expression in the evolution of Mars Whisky. First distilled at Japan's highest elevation distillery, Mars Shinshu in Nagano, with 50% of the distillate then transferred to the Mars Yakushima Island Aging Cellar off the coast of southern Japan. Yakushima Island is a World Heritage Site known for 1000 year old cedar trees, untouched nature and rain 300+ days a year. After 3 years of aging the whiskies are married again in Nagano to create this fascinating Double Cellars release.

By pushing the boundaries of Japanese whisky production, Mars is widely becoming known as Japan's most prolific craft whisky distillery.

MARS DISTILLERY

Mars Whisky is located between Japan's soaring Southern Alps and the towering Central Alps. The Hombo family have been distilling for more than a century and added whisky to their repertoire in 1949. At that time the distillery was located in the Tsunuki region of Kagoshima Prefecture on the southern-most island of Kyushu.

Until 1984, it was the southernmost whisky made in Japan, which ended when the Hombo clan moved the distillery to the idyllic alpine setting of Miyada village in southern Nagano Prefecture, Central Japan. They chose this site for its cool temperature, which slowed maturation, and the plentiful soft granite filtered snowmelt fed aquifers.
